

12 RESPONSIBLE CONSUMPTION AND PRODUCTION

RESponsible Consumption & Production: WHY IT MATTERS

What is the goal here?
To ensure sustainable consumption and production patterns

Why?
More people globally are expected to join the middle class over the next two decades. This is good for individual prosperity but it will increase demand for already constrained natural resources. If we don't act to change our consumption and production patterns, we will cause irreversible damage to our environment.

If the global population reaches 9.6 billion by 2050, the equivalent of almost three planets will be required to sustain current lifestyles

- By 2030 achieve the sustainable management and efficient use of natural resources
- By 2030 halve per capita global food waste at the retail and consumer levels and reduce food losses along production and supply chains
- By 2020, achieve the environmentally sound management of chemicals and all wastes throughout their life cycle
- Promote public procurement practices that are sustainable
- Rationalize inefficient fossil-fuel subsidies that encourage wasteful consumption by removing market distortions

- Cities – Bristol, Manchester, York; GLA exploring




How can you engage government?
